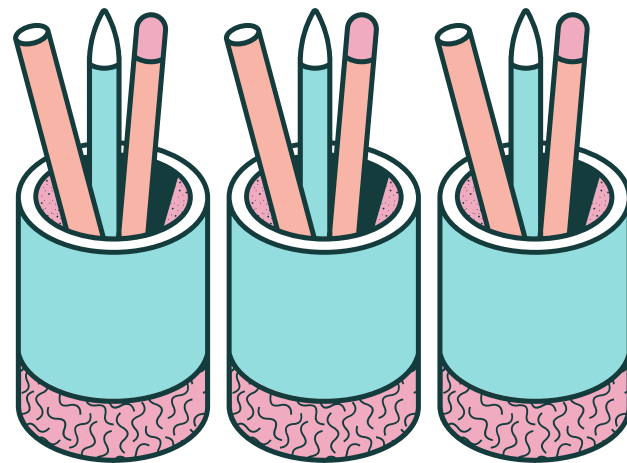
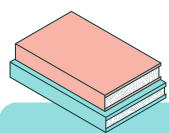


# ADVERB OF CERTAINTY

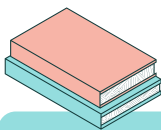


The Adverbs of certainty represent the possibility of an activity or action to happen. In a sentence, it precedes the main verb. If "to be" is used as a main verb in a sentence, the certainty adverb succeeds the main verb. It is used to show how certain someone is for anything.

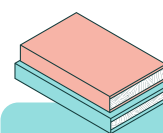
## RULES TO USE ADVERB OF CERTAINTY



Place them before the main verb in a sentence, except when "to be" is used as a main verb.



When a sentence has an auxiliary verb, it come between the main verb and auxiliary verb.



They can be found at the beginning of a sentence.

## EXAMPLE SENTENCES

- She will definitely get the distinction in the exam.
- She might go to university tomorrow.
- You may be successful if you follow this strategy.
- You will probably have some financial issues if you leave the job.
- Perhaps she is right.
- Maybe I am not doing it the right way.
