

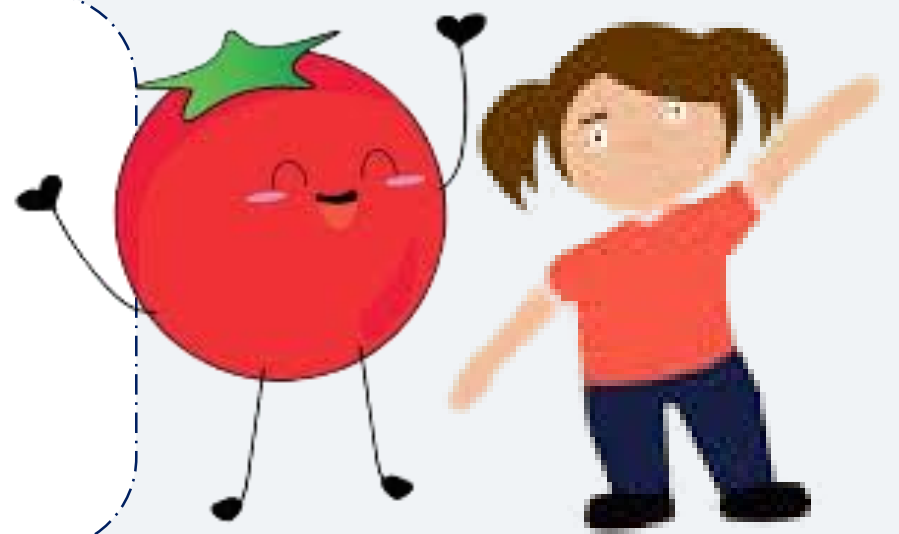
RELATIVE PRONOUNS



A Relative pronoun is a type of pronoun used to introduce a relative clause in a sentence. It includes who, which, what, whom, or whose.

Relative Pronouns List:

- Who
- Whom
- Which
- What
- That



Example Sentences:

- Anna, **who** is a doctor, also works as a lecturer.
- The bike **that** was lost last month was stolen.
- Ellen is the boy **whom** she was talking about.



Relative Pronoun	Usage	Example
Which	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Used in non-restrictive clause•Refers to things	The home, which I bought yesterday, needs renovation
That	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Used in restrictive clause•Refers to things	The last house that I owned wasn't ventilated.
Who	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Used as subject Pronoun•Refers to people	The girl who sits next to me is Aira.
Whom	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Used as an object Pronoun•Refers to People	I don't know the names of my classmates, whom I never interacted with.
