TYPES OF REGULAR VERBS

Regular verbs in the <u>Past Tense</u>:

These generally end with '-ed.' They show the actions that are completed.

Example Sentences:

- She liked the dinner.
- He talked to his father.

Regular verbs in the present Tense:

These don't usually conjugate. Their spellings alter if they are used in the third-person singular. Add "s" at the end in this case.

Example Sentences:

- I like the dinner.
- She talks to her father.

Regular verbs in <u>F</u>uture Tense:

They generally end with auxiliary verbs. Auxiliary verbs include will or shall.

Example Sentences:

- I will love the lunch if you'll cook.
- We will learn languages.
